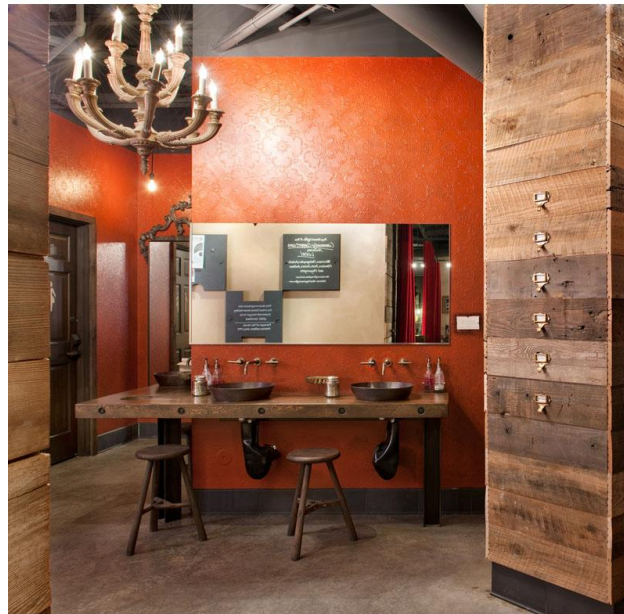




New Starbucks stores earn Pioneer Millworks Grand Prize awards for their reclaimed antique barn wood.
