

Larch—Exterior Siding, Select

Our Larch exterior siding is a great choice for those looking for a durable wood siding option that wears similar to cedar. Our Select Grade is primarily harvested from standing dead trees in British Columbia. These old growth logs yield boards with tight grain and fewer knots, which are insect resistant and moderately rot-resistant. In our select grade, widths up to 10" nominal are available

Order it prefinished with a non-VOC water-based penetrating sealer to save time and money on installation. Our natural finish option will highlight the variations and textures of the Larch, or choose one of our color stain options.

Why Larch?

Larch is an underutilized species with rot resistance greater than Douglas fir, an attractive grain, neutral color, and affordability that make it an ideal wood for siding products. Much of the Larch that we will be using will be sourced from "standing dead" trees. Unlike Douglas fir which deteriorates after a mere 18 months after death, these 400-500 year old Larch trees remain remarkably pristine decades after they have given up the ghost. These trees yield some spectacularly clear and tight grain boards. By keeping this wood out of pulp mills and fireplaces, you are also doing your part to reduce carbon emissions.

Shiplap Dimensions:
